NOTIFICATION

Whereas, the Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District, has submitted the proposal to Government requesting to grant Private University status to be named as ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY.

Whereas, the Government has referred the same to the Karnataka State Higher Education Council to inspect the Institution about its infrastructure etc., and submit its report to Government.

Whereas, the Karnataka State Higher Education Council has submitted its report. Based on the report of the Committee, Government has prepared draft ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Bill and placed it before the Karnataka Legislature for its approval. After obtaining the approval of the Legislature and assent of Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012 was published in the Official Gazette dated: 8-2-2013 and it was given effect from 22nd January 2018 as published in the Official Gazette.

Whereas, as per Section 3 of ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012, the Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), has submitted the proposal to Government for establishment of the ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY. Accordingly, Government of Karnataka has constituted a Committee vide its order No. ED 254 URC 2017, dated: 11-1-2018 to inspect the physical infrastructure available with Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), and to submit its report in terms of Section 3(3) of the said Act.

Whereas, the Committee constituted for the purpose, visited the Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District, and also the land earmarked to establish its University campus at B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District, on 16-1-2018 and after due inspection submitted its report to Government on 18-1-2018 on the issues as contained in Clauses (i) to (xiii) of Section 3(3) the ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012.

Whereas, the Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), has created Statutory Fund of Rs.15.00 crores (Rupees Fifteen Crores only) as stipulated under Section 4 read with proviso to Section 47 of the ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012.

Now, therefore, after considering all the facts, Government of Karnataka has accorded approval with the following terms and conditions to Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District, in accordance with Section 4(2) of ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012 to establish and commence a Private University in the name and style "ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY" at B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District.

1. The Adichunchanagiri Shikshana Trust (R), shall have the right to establish the University of Unitary Nature subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
2. Since the University is being located at B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District. the University shall establish a permanent Statutory Endowment Fund of Rs.15.00 Crores, out of which Rs.10.00 Crores shall be deposited in cash which shall be operated by the University with the joint signature of the Additional Chief Secretary/Principal Secretary to Government and remaining amount of Rs.5.00 Crores shall be in the form of Bank Guarantee.
3. The nature and functions of the University shall be strictly as per the provisions of ADICHUNCHANAGIRI UNIVERSITY Act, 2012. It shall also comply the rules that will be made under the Act in due course. The University shall also comply all the prevailing relevant laws, which concern the governance of the University in any aspect.
4. Agenda matters shall be dealt as per section 2(b) of the Act.
5. "Statutes" and "Regulations" of the University under the Act shall be made within a period of 3 months from the date of this Notification.
6. The University is permitted to start the following courses in the campus, only after ensuring that necessary faculty is recruited and requisite infrastructure such as lab etc. is provided as per UGC Guidelines:-

- 7 As per section 4(3) and 6 of the Act, the University is not allowed to affiliate any other existing colleges of its own management till completion of five years and those colleges shall continue to be affiliated to the existing respective regular Universities. The constituent colleges, additional campuses, Regional Centres or Study Centres can only be established after five years from the date of commencement of the University with the prior permission of the state Government and shall be as per the norms of UGC and other National Accreditation bodies.
- 8 As per section 4(7) of the Act the property of the University shall be used for the purpose and objects of the University only.
- 9 The Trust shall possess land to an extent at least forty acres.
- 10 The University shall always strive to achieve Global Standards and shall promote research and all progressive academic activities vigorously as per Section 7 of the Act.
- 11 The fees and other charges that may be collected by the University shall be as per the Statutes and rules as per section 8(v). Further provisions of section 38 of the Act regarding the Fee Regulation Committee shall be complied with.
- 12 The reservations in admissions shall be as per section 9 of the Act.
- 13 National Accreditations shall be sought from respective statutory bodies as per section 10 of the Act.
- 14 The directions of the Visitor to the University i.e. the Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka shall be complied by the University as and when they are issued.
- 15 All the statutory bodies and statutory functions are to be complied by the University well in time as per Act.
- 16 The periodical statutory reports shall be submitted to Government as per provisions of the Act.
- 17 The University shall prepare annual accounts as per section 53 of the Act and also the audit of the University shall be taken up as per sub section 2 of 53 of the Act.
- 18 The University shall place the annual accounts and audit reports before the Board of Governors before 30th November every year.
- 19 The Board of Governors shall send the annual accounts along with the annual reports and audit reports before 31st December every year to the Government.

An Act to establish and incorporate in the State of Karnataka a University of unitary nature in Private Sector to promote and undertake the advancement of University Education in Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences, Agricultural Sciences and Technology, Management and Technology, Natural Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences and allied sectors and for the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Whereas it is expedient to establish and incorporate in the State of Karnataka a University of unitary nature in private sector to promote and undertake the advancement of University Education in Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences, Agricultural Sciences and Technology, Management and Technology, Natural Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences and allied sectors and for the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto for the purposes hereinafter appearing:

Be it enacted by the Karnataka State Legislature in the sixty third year of the Republic of India as follows:-

CHAPTER - I
PRELIMINARY

1. Short title, extent and commencement.- (1) This Act may be called Adichunchanagiri University Act, 2012.

(2) It extends to the whole of the State of Karnataka

(3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint.

2. Definitions.- In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-

- (a) "Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the University as specified in section 25;
- (b) "Agenda Matters" means all the matters and business to be designated in the Statutes each of which can be either included in the Agenda or be taken up for discussion and decision at a meeting of the Board of Governors or the Board of Management or any Committees, as the case may be, only subject to the prior written approval of the Chancellor, consenting to the passing of such matters and business at such a meeting;
- (c) "Board of Governors" means the Board of Governors of the University as constituted under section 23;
- (d) "Board of Management" means the Board of Management of the University as constituted under section 24;
- (e) "Chancellor", "Vice-Chancellor", "Pro Vice-Chancellor" means respectively the Chancellor, Vice Chancellor and Pro Vice Chancellor of the University;
- (f) "Campus" means a campus established, maintained by the University;
- (g) "Committees" means the committees formed under this Act or by the various functionaries of the University as the case may be and includes the Nomination Committee, the Finance Committee, and such other committees;
- (h) "Constituent College" means a college or institution established and maintained by the University;
- (i) "Finance Committee" means the Finance Committee of the University as constituted under section 27;
- (j) "Government" means the Government of Karnataka;
- (k) "National Accreditation Bodies" means a body established by the Central Government for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring academic standards of higher education, such as University Grants Commission, All India Council of Technical Education, Medical Council of India, Pharmaceutical Council of India, Indian Council of Agriculture Research, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, National Council of Teacher Education, Distance Education Council, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, and includes the Government;
- (l) "Prescribed" means prescribed by rules made by the Government under this Act.

A revised provisional recognition order was issued to the institution on 16.05.2015 for conducting B.Ed. programme of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 for two basic units of 50 students each from the academic session 2015-16.

3. AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 348th meeting held on 05th – 06th December, 2017 considered the VT report and decided to issue Show Cause Notice. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, a Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 12.12.2017. The institution has submitted reply on 21.12.2017.

4. AND WHEREAS, the SRC In its 381st meeting held on 31st Oct & 01stNov, 2019 considered the matter and decided to issue SCN in all such matters where the institution has not submitted the requisite documents/VT report along with requisite documents. Accordingly, as per decision of SRC, a Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 07.09.2020. The institution has submitted reply on 21.09.2020 & 15.02.2021.

3. AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 394th meeting held on 27th – 28th January, 2021 has considered the matter and decided to issue a last reminder letter. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, a last reminder letter was issued to the institution on 05.02.2021.

4. AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 396th meeting held on 03rd March, 2021 has considered the matter and decided to issue a letter. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, a letter was issued to the institution on 10.03.2021. The institution has submitted reply on 24.03.2021.

The Committee on the perusal of the reply submitted by the institution, decided that the continuation order be issued to the Institution B.G.S. College of Education, Survey No. 122A, Chunchanahally Panchayat, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District-571811, Karnataka for B.Ed. programme for 2 basic units of 50 students each".

8. **NOW THEREFORE**, this order is issued permitting the institution i.e., B.G.S. College of Education, Survey No. 122A, Chunchanahally Panchayat, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District-571811, Karnataka run by Sri Adichunchnagiri Shikshana Trust, Mandya District-571811, Karnataka for Continuation of recognition for B.Ed. programme for two-year duration with annual intake of 2 basic units of 50 students each subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:

- I. The Endowment fund of Rs. 5 lakhs and Reserve fund of Rs. 7 lakhs kept in joint account with Regional Director of NCTE should be maintained perpetually. Raising loan against the FDRs or mortgaging them shall not be done.

- ❖ One of the important missions of ACU is to provide an effective teaching learning opportunity to its students. Integrating technology in teaching makes learning interesting and effective.
- ❖ All the faculty of institution use ICT enabled tools regularly in the classes. Online teaching platforms such as AMZCI ZLIPP /Medwhiz, Microsoft teams, google meet, zoom app, Google classrooms are utilized by faculty for online sessions.
- ❖ All departments are equipped with laptops, desktop computers, printers, scanners, pen drives, multimedia projectors, and screens. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled, facilitating connectivity to various educational websites, national and international health-related platforms, and YouTube for video demonstrations.
- ❖ Currently there are 146 rooms with LCD screens, Wi-Fi LAN facilities, and 24 smart boards.
- ❖ DHI ERP Software: The ACU has Dhi (ERP) Software for smooth conduct of curricular and co-curricular activities at the level of its constituent colleges. The Automation Platform, built using cutting-edge technology, is envisioned to be a data-driven, continuous improvement enabler for individuals & Institutions in the education system to realize their potential.
- ❖ E-Lectures: Faculty of the Institution design and develop e-Lectures using the following applications
- ❖ Microsoft Teams: - Microsoft Teams lets educators to create vibrant learning environments by engaging the students with virtual face-to-face connections and activities. Educators can track student progress in their daily work using Assignments.
- ❖ Zoom Sessions: -It helps to enhance and expand classes with powerful collaboration tools, including video breakout rooms, multi-sharing, polling, and group chats.
- ❖ Google Meet Sessions: - Google Meet helps the faculties to keep themselves organized and allows them to connect and collaborate with the students in real time.

Academic Infrastructure

Adichunchanagiri University has the infrastructure to fulfil the statutory requirements for all the academic programs. ACU has >1 GBPS bandwidth leased line for internet connectivity and the entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled. All the classrooms, seminar halls, laboratories, hospitals, research centres and libraries are ICT enabled.

There are 10 hostel blocks with a total of 1219 rooms with capacity to accommodate 3476 students. Hostels have the facility of indoor games, yoga, dance and music rooms etc., ACU has outdoor and indoor sports facilities for cricket, football, tennis, basketball, volleyball, and badminton, along with a jogging track and amphitheatre.

The campus has two banks with ATM facility, 24 hours electricity supply, RO systems, waste disposal facilities, sewage treatment plant, landscaped gardens and parks, round the clock safety & security deployment. ACU boasts a robust network of multidisciplinary super-speciality hospital, equipped with 1,150 beds, along with teaching and peripheral health centres, designed to provide top-notch clinical training and nurture social responsibility.

The outpatients and inpatients are adequate for training the students in all the related programs. "Skill & Simulation Centre" is used for practical training on the simulators. The well-stacked, air-conditioned Learning Resource Centre utilizes fully automated KOHA software. The learning resource centre is spread over an area of 5057 Sqm, with a seating capacity for more than 650 students, with 87,978 books, 250 journals, 7,943 bound volumes, 2608 CDs and Videos and more than five digital databases. The maintenance department, which includes skilled employees in all fields, functions 24/7 to support physical and academic infrastructure.

The research program from 1998 till April 2017 has been mainly centred around dietary antioxidants in prevention of oxidative stress, which is now recognized as a possible etiological factor for many diseases like Cancer, arthritis, cataract, heart ailments, snake bite, malaria, bacterial, fungal infections. It is a matter of pride that the institute has been funded by National Cancer Institute of National Institute of Health towards developing the Turmeric peptide as a possible cancer preventive biomolecule under RAPID program. It is a matter of very high satisfaction that, our two publications have been cited as the top entities as most read, downloaded and cited among 2000 publications.

In brief, we have discovered a very potent antioxidant from Turmeric with a molecular weight of 8 kDa which we have named as “Arishinin”. This discovery is patented at the Chennai patent office for Indian patent and also has been awarded US patent (US 8,389,677B2).

The institute was successful in identifying a death factor released by fuel, cigarette or organic smoke called SCID (Smoke Condensate Induced Death factor). We have also reported death factors released from snake venom called as PID-15 (Phospholipase Induced Death factor -15). The above two factors appear to be death signalling peptides. Other than the above, we have purified a 14 kDa protein from Turmeric and also sequenced the above and registered it in Swiss Uniprot (Uniprot P85278).

Now, the laboratory is mainly focusing on synthesis and developing new chemical entities/ drug like small molecules in the field of Cancer, Leishmaniasis and Diabetes. The drug discovery involves the identification of lead molecules, screening hits, and optimization of those hits to increase the affinity, selectivity, efficacy/potency, metabolic stability and bioavailability.

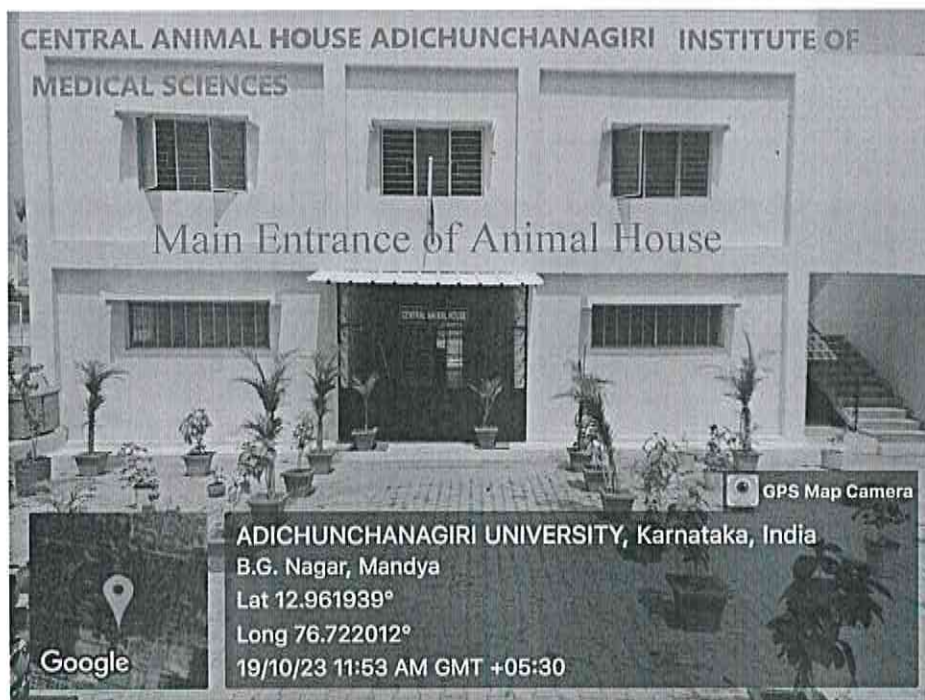


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CENTRAL ANIMAL HOUSE

We have a state-of-the-art central animal house facility attached to the department of Pharmacology at Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences B.G. Nagar. The animal house facility is approved by CPCSEA, Govt. of India with registration number 495/Po/Re/S/01/CPCSEA date of registration 21/04/2022. The infrastructure consists of provisions for maintaining 200-300 rodents (both mice and rats) and 50 rabbits. The facilities are utilized by our postgraduate students and all the faculty members of our institution. We mainly carry out animal experiments related to the Pharmacology and toxicology field.



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ANIMAL HOUSE FACILITY AT PHARMACY DEPARTMENT

Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Pharmacy has a well-ventilated animal house and has a build-up area of 39.00 sq. mt. The Committee for the Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals (CCSEA) has approved the animal house facility for experimentation (Reg. no: 377/PO/ReBi/S/01/CPCSEA). The animal house is maintained in accordance with CPCSEA guidelines. Different sections in animal houses are made as per the CPCSEA guidelines viz. Storage area, Animal stock room, Experimental room, Disposal area, clean corridors, Washing area, Quarantine section etc.

The facility is equipped for small animal experimentation with quarantine and experimental rooms for rodents and rabbits. The temperature, humidity, dark and light cycles are monitored in the animal house. The health status of the animals is being monitored regularly by a veterinarian. The animal species are being used for various research projects approved by the Institutional Animal Ethics Committee (IAEC).



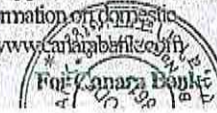

A. Observations of the Committee

1. The infrastructure built to run its medical, pharmacy and nursing wings deserves special mention. Modern facilities in the ICUs, N-ICUs, advanced diagnostic tools, and high-tech cardiac and neuro divisions are needed.
2. It leaves a signature of vibrant current activities and also demonstrates its potential of steadily rising quality and service.
3. Nursing facilities, pharmacy projects and various training programs in these disciplines are indeed excellently designed serving independent as well as complementary roles to the medical units.
4. The University has been trying its level best to encourage interdisciplinary research activities keeping in consideration the demand of the hour.
5. University's pharmacy wing is playing pivotal role along with medical wing to bring various projects to generate revenues and keep up their pace of development. Strategies for more investment, revenue generation, bringing funds through Govt funded and industry-sponsored projects/consultancies.
6. During interaction with the Academic Staff by the Committee Members, it was observed that replies on the issue relating to the Salary(in terms of scale/consolidated amount) and various components of the gross salary, Increments, Promotional avenues, mode of appointment etc were not given freely and clearly not open.
7. Similar position was noticed during interaction with the non-academic staff.

B. Suggestions of the Committee which require satisfactory compliance by the University

1. Approval from the regulatory Councils for all the programs required.
2. The university has eight faculties. In some places, these are also shown as constituent units and constituent colleges. The constituent colleges are not mentioned in the University ACT. The ACT says it is a unitary university. There is a lack of clarity.

3. The university needs to provide the required UGC scale and State Scales to teachers and non-teaching staff, respectively.
4. It is felt that rapid and strong drive must be initiated for central research facility development, which requires strategies for more investment, revenue generation, and bringing funds through Govt.-funded and industry-sponsored projects/consultancies.
5. Inviting peers to give talk to motivate faculty/staffs and students and to chalk out improved strategies to sustain and excel more in both academic and research front.
6. Higher fund investment in research front by strengthening central facilities and improvement of strategies to generate revenues through engineering infrastructure.
7. Maintaining an improved gender ratio to a realistic extent in employment, considering aspect of women empowerment.
8. More teachers with the qualifications as prescribed by the regulatory body, concerned, may be appointed.
9. The engineering division left a few areas for a good scope of modernization, where immediate attention should be given. For example, the machine tool lab requires CNC machines, the measurement/metrology lab requires advanced machines like CMM and AE and ML lab require more facilities to interface software and physical systems. Industrial interfaces like establishing some CoEs with leading private sector industries have also been noticed. It is felt necessary that the university should do more to strengthen the academia-industry interface and it should be more prioritized through various training/project-based programmes for the students to give them more exposure to industries or inviting industries for workshops to align the mindset of students to the industrial requirement.
10. The university should obtain the necessary accreditations.

C. Final Recommendations

The Committee after conducting virtual visit to Adichunchanagiri University, Karnataka, interaction with Students, Teachers and non teaching staff and based on submitted records recommends to UGC that UGC may consider issuing approval letter to Adichunchanagiri University, Karataka subject to the compliance of suggestions mentioned at part IV (B) above.



1. OBJECTIVES:

- ❖ To promote quality education to all.
- ❖ To impart scientific, social, economic and cultural values to the students.
- ❖ To provide education to the diversified groups to achieve their goals.
- ❖ To offer education to the poor people at an affordable price and to provide access to all.
- ❖ To admit students based on merit irrespective of caste, class, creed, gender or nation.
- ❖ To admit students as per the provisions of the ACU Act, 2012 and relevant guidelines from the State Government amended from time to time.

2. ESTABLISHMENT:

Adichunchanagiri University is established as per the Adichunchanagiri University Act, 2012 and notified through official gazette on 22nd January 2018. University is unitary in nature with campus based at BG Nagara and has its own constituent colleges. Adichunchanagiri University is multi-disciplinary in nature with courses in medicine, pharmacy, engineering, management & technology, nursing, natural sciences and humanities & social sciences. These constituent colleges shall provide quality education to the students.

3. MODE OF ADMISSION:

- ❖ Admissions in all the courses under Adichunchanagiri University should be based as per the provisions of the ACU Act, 2012 and on merit. Admissions to the courses in the Constituent Colleges shall be in accordance with the minimum eligibility norms stipulated by the regulatory authorities, UGC and State Government norms.
- ❖ As per Section 9 of ACU Act, 2012, admissions to 40 % of seats in all courses shall be reserved for the students from Karnataka and admissions shall be based on the qualifying examinations conducted by the State government and on merit. Admissions under this category is as per the State Government policy on reservations as amended from time to time. All seats are admitted by the State Government through National/ State/ University (KCET).
- ❖ Admissions to the remaining 60 % of seats in all courses reserved for management quota shall be based on the qualifying examinations conducted by the National/ State/ University and or on merit as drawn from the merit list prepared by the State government / University as the case may be. Admissions to all seats in medical courses shall be as per the Entrance Examinations / Exit examinations conducted by National Testing Agency (NEET/ NEET-PG) / NMC as the case may be.



4. PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE PRINCIPAL:

- ❖ To make assessment and analyze the trend in admissions and plan accordingly.
- ❖ To promote for admissions through various print and visual media.
- ❖ To prepare and present before the relevant Government authorities all necessary documents for inclusion under the counselling process for admission to forty percent seats in all courses.
- ❖ To inform state government the tuition fees fixed by the Fee Fixation Committee of University for all courses and notify the same.
- ❖ To prepare / acquire merit list of students found eligible through the Government conducted entrance examinations.
- ❖ To prepare merit list of students eligible for admissions to sixty percent of seats in all courses for management seats.
- ❖ To submit list of students provisionally admitted to different courses under various categories to the University on the last date of admission as per the calendar of events notified by the University.

5. ANY OTHER:

Any issue which is not specified in the Policy will be decided by the Vice-Chancellor on the approval of the Board of Management.

POLICY ON CURRICULUM DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

GOAL AND PURPOSE

- This Policy shall ensure inclusive, uniform and standardized processes across all constituent institutions / units of Adichunchanagiri University with regard to Curriculum Design, Development, Revision and Implementation.
- Curricular input processes must include all relevant stakeholders and follow a systematic and dynamic approach in accordance with local, regional, national and global needs in alignment with Regulatory requirements of the apex bodies viz., UGC, AICTE, NMC, PCI, NCI, NCTE etc.).
- Curriculum implementation must include best practices for teaching-learning & continuous assessment.
- Uniformity and standardized processes are key to enable successful curricular alignment and hence achievement of defined Programme and Course Outcomes.
- Outcome analysis of student performance and attainment must be regularly carried out for all programmes and courses be used for curricular improvement. Curriculum revision must include content and process analysis that is need-based, relevant innovative and dynamic.

OBJECTIVES

- To define a standard procedure for curriculum design, development and to implementation for monitoring curriculum teaching-learning-assessment in a uniform manner while make improvements/revisions as necessary, including faculty development to ensure teacher quality
- Although all constituent units follow the directives of respective regulatory councils, this policy will help to ensure that in all constituent units, curriculum processes are uniformly implemented and monitored in a student-centred manner, towards attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes.
- To integrate cross-cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainable human values and professional ethics into the curriculum.
- To enable learners to be self-reliant by developing entrepreneurial skills.

METHODOLOGY FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE POLICY

The policy consists of the following four components

- A. Curriculum Planning**
- B. Curricular Implementation (Teaching – Learning)**
- C. Outcome Analysis**
- D. Curricular Revision**

A. CURRICULUM PLANNING

- Curriculum Planning shall be initiated at the Departmental Level
- For new programs as well as existing programs, the HOD with inputs from faculty, alumni, external subject experts shall prepare the curriculum focusing on and justifying relevance of curricular content to
 - Local, regional, national and global needs
 - Student aspirations and career goals
- Course content shall be mapped to the POs and COs for all programs and courses and the learning outcome competencies (LOCs) for cognitive, psychomotor as well as affective domains, written and aligned with teaching-learning and assessment methods:
- Curricular implementation strategies should include multiple methods, aligned to Learning Outcome Competencies (LOCs) and that are student centric, participatory, actively engaging the learners, promoting problem solving and critical thinking, enabling experiential learning and development of skills, values and ethics.
- Integrated (intra- and trans-disciplinary) learning with special reference to cross-cutting issues, communication skills, environment and sustainability, health determinants using horizontal and vertical integration, problem-based learning, team-based learning, etc.
- The development of the contents of the curriculum includes the following aspects:
 - Graduate Attributes,
 - Credit Distribution,
 - Course Structure,
 - Selection of contents for each course
 - Distribution of learning Hours,
 - Teaching strategies,
 - Criteria of Evaluation
 - Suggested readings

- The above shall be submitted to the concerned Board of Studies through the and Dean/Principal of the constituent college.
- The Board of Studies shall review the same and modify/accept the changes, after thorough discussion, deliberation. The Board shall recommend the same to the Academic Council.
- Modification if any of Program Outcomes (PO's) and Course Outcomes (CO's) for Programmes / Courses, shall include:
 - Curricular enrichment
 - Innovations
 - Holistic student development and
 - Continuous progression of learning
 - Newer assessment methods
- The Academic Council shall examine the curriculum proposals of the various Boards of Studies and approve with suggested changes or refer back the curriculum to BOS with suggestions for modification
- The Board of Management shall examine the curriculum proposed by the Academic Council and approve with suggested changes or refer back the curriculum to Academic Council for modification
- The curricula / curricular changes approved by the University shall be communicated to the concerned Constituent Unit for implementation.
- Committee for Academic Council is also authorized to approve some minor changes/ modification subject to the approval of the Academic Council

B. CURRICULAR IMPLEMENTATION

- The HoD and Faculty members in consultation with experts from academia and industry shall develop the Curricular Implementation Plan and Schedule (Including content mapping, innovative Teaching-Learning and Assessment Methods and new topics) for implementation by the Departments

Curricular implementation at the department level shall include

- Course-wise Curriculum Content mapping to POs and COs
- Topic / Unit-wise - Specific Learning Objectives (SLO's) by Department including all three domains – cognitive, psychomotor and affective
- Development of lesson plans for all assigned teaching sessions.
- Student Feedback and a Continuous Assessment Plan followed by all Departments
- Support to students with special reference to advanced learners and slow performers

- Feedback collected periodically from all stakeholders to identify and drawing pertinent pointers to enhance the learning effectiveness.
- Necessary infrastructure, resource materials and facilities shall be provided to all departments as per Regulatory norms and as per specific requirements of the course
- Teaching-Learning and Assessment following contemporary educational approaches
- Process manual for documentation of all teaching-learning, formative and continuous assessment processes shall be developed and followed by every department for every course and program
- Responsibility of the Department to conduct Outcome Analysis and prepare a report for each academic year.
- Regular training of all faculty so that they are updated to ensure quality of implementation

Responsibilities

For effective and efficient implementation of the curriculum of a programme, all the required infrastructure, human resources, books, journals, laboratory facilities, other resources and tools shall be made available. The Heads of the Departments (HoDs) and the concerned faculty teaching courses shall be responsible for implementation of the curriculum prescribed.

C. OUTCOME ANALYSIS

The curriculum needs to be assessed regularly for bringing necessary improvements in it keeping in pace with the changing dynamics of the concerned discipline and the society as a whole. For regular improvement/revision of the curriculum, the process defined above shall be followed.

The feedback of stakeholders in Curriculum Assessment and Improvement is crucial. At the end of each semester, feedback shall be collected from all the stakeholders like students, teachers, alumni, and industry experts about different aspects of the curriculum including its learning outcomes, content relevance and potential for development of expected skills. The report of the analyses of feedback shall be placed before the Board of Studies, for bringing necessary changes and improvements in the curriculum.

D.THE CURRICULUM ANALYSIS FOR EACH PROGRAM AND COURSE SHALL INCLUDE

1. Need-based identification of changes.
2. Review of national trends (regulatory guidelines, updates, guidelines) in disease patterns, Teaching Learning and Assessment / Evaluation Methods.
3. Review of global trends in disease patterns, emerging areas in the curriculum Teaching Learning and Assessment / Evaluation Methods.
4. Review of Local and regional needs and relevance and correlation to available and possible career pathways.
5. Review of stakeholder feedback (Students, Faculty, Practitioners and Visiting faculty experts).
6. Outcome Analysis Data for concerned Academic Year.
7. The cycle of curricular analysis, planning, implementation, and outcome analysis will
8. be done after every academic year.
9. A meeting of curriculum review committee should be organized at the college level to assess the compiled feedbacks received from all stakeholders. After rigorous discussion on the valuable inputs given in the feedback, curriculum review committee performs various modifications in the curriculum, still keeping it consistent with existing scheme. These changes are proposed in Board of Studies for further implementation.

International Student Admission Policy (NRI/PIO/Overseas)

1. Introduction:

These rules define the procedure for the admission of International students to various courses. These rules are based on General Guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and Statutory/ Regulatory directives issued from time to time.

2. The office of the registrar:

The office of the registrar will provide necessary guidance for admission. All letters relating to international students should be addressed to the office of the registrar of the University.

3. International Students:

- i. **Foreign students:** Students holding passports issued by foreign countries including people of Indian origin who have acquired the nationality of foreign countries.
- ii. **Non- Resident Indians (NRI):** Only those Non Resident Indian students who have studied and passed the qualifying examinations from schools or colleges in foreign countries will be included as international students. This will include the students studying in the schools or colleges situated in foreign countries even if affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Higher Secondary Education or Universities located in India, but will not include students studying in those schools or colleges (situated in India) and affiliated to the Boards of Secondary Higher Secondary Education or Universities of foreign countries. Students passing the qualifying examinations from Boards or Universities located in foreign countries as external students and Dependents of NRI studying in India will not merit the status of international students.

Entry level status of International students on entry to the country will be maintained.

4. Documents required for admission of International Students:

- i. **Visa:** All the international students will require a student visa endorsed to this Institution for joining full time courses. No other endorsement is acceptable. Students wishing to join a research programme will require a research visa endorsed to this Institution. The visa should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course. Visa is not required for NRI students.
- ii. All international students wishing to undertake any research work or join a Ph.D programmes will have to obtain prior security clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and the approval of Department of Secondary & Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development Government of India.

5. Eligibility Qualifications:

Only students having qualification recognized as equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are only eligible for admission.

- i. A candidate shall have completed 17 years of age on or before 31st December
- ii. Candidates seeking admission to Medical program must have studied the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English in Grades 11 & 12.
- iii. Under this category only the students who have studied and passed the qualifying examination from a school located in foreign country shall be considered. This will include the student studying in school and / or college situated in foreign country, even if the concerned school / college is affiliated to any Board of secondary Higher Secondary education or a University in India. However, wards of NRI / PIO / FN, who is studying for the qualifying examination in school / college located in India are excluded.
- iv. In case of any school that follows the American system of education, the candidate must have studied Physics, Chemistry and Biology at "AP" (Advanced Placement) level and must have minimum C grade in these subjects.
- v. The candidate shall get equivalence certificate from the Association of Indian University (AIU), New Delhi.

Equivalence Certificate:

For issue of Equivalence Certificate, US \$ 200 or equivalent Indian currency payable through Demand Draft favoring "Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi" is required.

For prescribed application form to be submitted to the "Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi"

6. Admission Procedure:

Admission of all the international students will be done through the Institution International Students' Cell. Students will be admitted in the beginning of the course.

A student wishing to join the University should submit application form to the Concerned college along with the prescribed fees. The college will then check the eligibility and issue the provisional admission letter. This is required to get the visa and to complete other formalities.

After getting provisional admission, the student should get the student visa and

complete all other formalities.

The student then report for final admission fills up the admission form and pays the required fees. The student should undergo the medical examination & also required to appear for the English proficiency test. Once this is done, the final admission is given.

The international students will have to pay the fees in US dollars. In special cases, payment of fees in the equivalent Indian Rupees may be considered. Following fees are applicable to secure provisional admission.

Processing Fee: US \$ 100 Eligibility Fee and Administrative Fee: US \$ 200 in case a student is not considered for admission to the course after obtaining provisional admission, the administrative fees will be refunded after deducting US\$ 75 towards the bank commission and postage.

7. Change of Course:

An international student who has been granted admission to a particular course shall not be allowed to change the course during his/her duration of the course. Transfer from one institution in India to another is also not permitted.

8. Summary:

Procedure for admission is summed up below:

Step 1: Students should purchase the International Student's Bulletin (including the eligibility form) and the prospectus of the University. This information is also available on the website.

Step 2: Fill up the eligibility form for international students and submit it, along with the copies of certificates listed in the eligibility form and the required fees. This should be done well in time so that the student is able to obtain the visa and NOC before the due date for admission.

Step 3: Get the provisional admission letter from Office of Registrar, ACU, in order to obtain the student visa.

Step 4: Produce the document of provisional admission to the Indian Embassy in the respective country and get a student visa endorsed to institution. NRI students do not require a visa.

Step 5: Report to the institution for admission. Fill the permanent admission form and submit it along with the following documents (in original along with a photo copy):

- a) Mark / Grade Statement of the qualifying examination
- b) Transfer / Scholl leaving Certificate from the Institute last attended,
- c) Nationality Certificate in case of N.R.I / P.I.O / F.N. Nationality Certificate of Guardian in case of P.I.O
- d) A photo copy of their passport - duly attested by a notary.
- e) Physical fitness certificate from a registered Physician

- f) Certificate from the owner/ Head of the Institute stating the length of service & Total emoluments if guardian if in service in foreign country,
- g) Income certificate from competent authority, in case the guardian is self-employed.

Note: The original certificates will be returned to the students immediately after making necessary endorsements.

Step 6: Undergo medical examination and obtain medical fitness certificate. As per government rules all international students entering India on student visa have to be tested for HIV and will not be given admission if found to be positive. All international students will be required to pay medical fees of US \$ 50, which includes the medical insurance cover for the first year. For subsequent years the medical insurance fees will be same as for other Indian students and is included in yearly fees.

Step 7: Appear for the proficiency test in English. This is only applicable, if the qualifying examination is not in the English medium.

Step 8: Admission of international students will be confirmed only after verification of original certificates, medical fitness test and payment of required fees.

Step 9: Within a week of arrival in India, register with the police in the Foreigner Regional Registration Office (FRRO) of the local Police.

9. Discipline:

The international students will abide by all the rules of the Institution and the code of conduct as applicable to Indian students doing same courses.

10. Examination and Award of Degrees & Diplomas:

The procedure for examination, payment of examination fees, issue of mark list, issue of passing certificates and award of degrees will be same as for the Indian students doing same courses.

11. Conclusion:

In case there are any differences in the interpretation of rules, opinion of the University will be final. The fees are liable to revision and students will have to pay the revised fees as and when applicable. On the points not specifically covered, the decision of the University authorities will be final.

Sub: Implementation of ACU Procurement Policy-2023 of the University

Ref: Approval from Board of Governors dated 28.12.2022

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Adichunchanagiri University is pleased to notify the ACU Procurement Policy-2023 of Adichunchanagiri University as per Section 23(6)(ii) of ACU Act, 2012 with effect from 01.01.2023. The policy as applicable is defined as below;

1. Preamble:

Adichunchanagiri University ("ACU") is situated in a Lush Green Unitary Campus of 67 acres at B.G. Nagara, Nagamangala Tq., Mandya District, Karnataka on the Bangalore – Mangalore National Highway No. 75, 105 Kms from Bangalore, the Capital City of Karnataka.

The University consists of Constituent colleges and units in the disciplines of Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing & Allied Health Sciences, Engineering, Management, Commerce, Natural Science, Education, Research and other institutes. ACU, as part of its maintaining & running the facility & infrastructure, and also as part of expanding the academic institutions and infrastructure, there will be continuous requirement of procurement and construction activity.

Broadly the procurement activities that can be identified in ACU are as follows;

1. Hospital Consumptions
2. Medical, Engineering, Pharmacy and others institutional consumables
3. Running and maintenance of all constituent colleges, units and hospital in the form of materials, equipment, instruments and service procurement/contracts.
4. Printing & stationery and other consumables procurements
5. Furniture and equipment's
6. Expenditure towards student activities
7. Repairs & maintenance of vehicles, equipment, buildings and related items.
8. Various kinds of consultancies and other services
9. Infrastructure expansions, constructions, other civil and interior works, big projects, Engineering, Procurement and Construction Contract (EPC).

2. Framework

This "Procurement Policy" (the "Policy") is to establish uniform procedures and processes, define responsibilities, and provide guidance. Adherence to this Policy is essential in order to ensure conformance with requirements, policies, Code of Conduct and Agreements of Adichunchanagiri University ("ACU").

For all procurement:

- a. ACU prepares an annual Budget spent (Capital and Operational) which is duly approved by the Board of Governors ('BOG')
- b. Procurement shall be made through tendering for value above Rs 10,000.
- c. All unbudgeted procurement for the amount above Rs 50,000 shall be approved by VC & Registrar and subsequently shall be approved in FC meeting.
- d. All unbudgeted procurement for the amount up to Rs 50,000 shall be approved by VC and Registrar.
- e. Procurement of amount up to Rs 10,000 can be made through online e-portal shopping (Preferably Amazon and Flipkart).
- f. Minimum 3 quotations/bids shall be obtained for all the procurement above Rs 10,000.





1. For an amount from Rs 10,000 to Rs 2,00,000 – Minimum of 3 Open Quotations/bids shall be obtained.
 2. Above Rs 2,00,001 – Minimum of 3 closed quotations shall be obtained.
 3. All tender/quotation request for the procurement above Rs 2,00,000 shall be published in ACU website.
 - g. Each RFQ (Request for Quote) shall be supported by Financial and Technical evaluation by End User.
 - h. Any renewals or amendments of terms to existing contracts resulting in respective values requires approval as per Authority Matrix (Annexure-1).
- 3. Approval Slab for procurement request:**
- a. Up to Rs 50,000, all procurement shall be approved by Unit Heads.
 - b. From Rs 50,001 to Rs 2,00,000 – shall be approved by Registrar and Finance Officer
 - c. From Rs 2,00,001 to Rs 5,00,000 shall be approved by Vice Chancellor
 - d. Above Rs 5,00,000 shall be approved by Chancellor.
- Note: The above-mentioned amount for approval matrix is considered as whole/single package/project/requirement within/for 12 months. Splitting of the package/project/requirement to suite to authority matrix is STRICTLY prohibited.*
- 4. Repeat order can be made to the same vendor for;**
- a. the same procurement, construction/interior contract, service contract for the amount up to Rs 2,00,000
 - b. any fresh requirement for the time period up to 12 months from the date of 1st delivery of the service, contract, materials.
 - c. Over and above of 1st order, the quantity proposed shall be purchased under the Repeat Order shall be - maximum repeat order is restricted to 3 orders of 100% of the 1st order or 6 orders of 50% of the 1st order,
 - d. The price shall either be equal or lower of 1st negotiated order price.
 - e. The remaining procurement and approval process shall be as per slab.
- 5. Rate Contract:**
- a. For items /services/ works, where the total requirement over a period of time is identified but long range stocking/storage/service is not recommended, due to avoidable blockage of funds, heavy inventory management etc., orders can be finalized based on one time tender where the supplier is informed that supplies/services will be required on need basis or in a phased manner (say once a month, once in a quarter or half yearly etc. over a fixed period time of one (1) year to two (2) years.
 - b. All contracts as far as possible shall be based on fixed rates and no price escalation shall be given except in case of statutory increase of Government levies / taxes.
 - c. Approval slab criteria is applicable based on the estimated annual total procurement cost
 - d. The remaining procurement and approval process shall be as per slab.
- 6. Purchase of Proprietary/Unique Items**
- a. Where the procurement of items or services is unique in nature or non-availability in market, the same can be procured with prior approval of approving authority, without calling for quotation.
 - b. Office Note, which shall be supplemented with valid reason for Proprietary/Unique Items, shall be approved by VC for the amount up to Rs 5,00,000 and Chancellor for the amount above Rs 5,00,000
 - c. The remaining process shall be as per this policy.





7. Process:

- a. Purchase Request (PR) Form has to be prepared by end user and send approved PR to Procurement department for all purchase above Rs 50,000.
- b. Procurement department to assess the requirement, estimate the procurement cost and to obtain approval as per the Slab approval matrix.
- c. Procurement department to float for tender quotation accordingly. All Techno Commercial terms shall clearly be mentioned in Tender request form.
- d. Tender opening and negotiation for all the procurement above Rs 50,000 shall be done inside the Procurement Room.
- e. People involved in Tender opening and negotiation process:
 1. For the amount up to Rs 50,000 –Unit Head & Unit Accountant.
 2. For the amount Rs 50,001 to Rs 5,00,000 – Along with Procurement Head, Minimum One person each from Finance, Procurement and end user shall participate and witness the tender opening and negotiation process.
 3. For the amount above Rs 5,00,000 – VC, Registrar, FO, Procurement Head and Unit Head shall participate and witness the tender opening and negotiation process.
- f. Negotiation shall be done in most transparent way and best interest of the University, considering the Techno Commercial methodology.
- g. For an amount above Rs 2,00,000 and up-to Rs 5,00,000- bid shall be opened by negotiation team and after considering the techno-commercial criteria, minimum 3 bidders shall be invited for negotiation.
- h. For an amount above Rs 5,00,000- All the bidders shall be called and bid documents shall be opened in front of the bidders.
- i. Venders shall personally attend and witness negotiation process for all the procurement above Rs 2,00,000. In case the vendor is not able to attend, his authorized representative shall attend.
- j. For the amount up to Rs 2,00,000 – Vendor shall attend preferably in person or in unavoidable circumstances, over video call. Video call shall be recorded and kept for 6 months from the date of negotiation.
- k. Final Negotiation document shall be approved by the authority as per the Authority Matrix.
 - l. The whole tender opening and negotiation process shall be recorded through CC TV and the recording shall be kept for 6 months from the date of negotiation.
- m. VC, Registrar & FO are authorized to visit tender room at any time during the tender opening & negotiation process and participate in negotiation process.
- n. VC, Registrar and FO are authorized to watch the negotiation process through CCTV.

8. Post Negotiation:

- a. Procurement department shall prepare required documents & obtain required approval and then to issue Purchase order. The PO shall be approved as per the slab.
- b. All payment terms shall be 15 days from the delivery date, except where statute requires otherwise. No advance payment is entertained.
- c. Retention money clause, Penalty clause, warranty period, quality guarantee terms, payments terms shall clearly be mentioned in agreements/contracts/purchase orders.
- d. PO shall be accepted and acknowledged by Vender.
- e. Once receipt of the service or materials, Goods Received Note (GRN) shall be sent to procurement department from end user within 3 days





- 9. Timeline for processing at various stages:** Procurement department to send Verified bills, along with GRN and PO copy to Finance for payment process.
- Approved Purchase Request from end user shall be submitted to Procurement Department at least 45 days before the material/service requirement date.
 - Procurement team shall do budget verification, techno commercial evaluation, obtaining required approval and finally, float a tender for quotation within 10 days from the date of receiving approved PR.
 - Procurement Team shall complete tender opening, negotiation, approvals and issuing Purchase Order within 10 days from the date of Floating a Tender.
 - Receiving of Material/Service shall be 7-14 days, depend upon type of Material/Service, from the date of PO. In case of unique items/construction contracts/interior works, bulky projects, the delivery time limit can be different based on realistic/practical/reasonable deliverable time.
 - Goods Received Note (GRN), by end user, shall be submitted within 3 days from the date of receipt of the material or service, to Procurement Department.
 - Procurement Department shall submit verified bills, GRN, PO copy and other required details to Finance Department within 7 days from the date of receipt of GRN and bills.
 - Finance Department shall verify all the supporting documents, comply all the statutory compliance, ensuring deduction of TDS, retention money, advance adjustment if any and then process & make payment within 10 days from the date of receiving the documents from Procurement Department.

- All such deviations shall be brought to the next Finance Committee meeting.

- Hostels – Hostel In charge/Principals
- Labs – Respective college Principals
- ACU head office – Vice Chancellor





12. Important Note:

- The whole procurement process shall be led by **Procurement Officer/Head**. Procurement Officer/Head **shall report to Vice Chancellor**.
- Similar dated approved Authority Matrix is addendum to this policy. Authority Matrix shall be referred along with this policy for approval process.
- The approved procurement policy and authority matrix are subject to change/modification by the approving authority. As and when the same is amended, the revised policy and matrix shall be applicable.
- In case of Grants/Donations/Subsidy received with the specific guidelines to spend / to follow specific procurement procedures, then the above policy is not applicable to that specific Grants/Donations/Subsidy related expenditure.

13. Effective date:

The above Policy is applicable from 06 January 2023.

POLICY ON EXAMINATION PROCESS

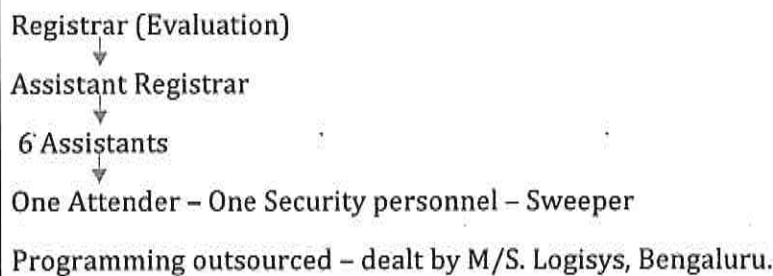
PURPOSE : To plan and conduct exams for UG and PG courses to evaluate student's education and learning levels, generating student results, convocation and maintaining student marks/results.

SCOPE : Covers the examination lifecycle with following 5 sub-processes:

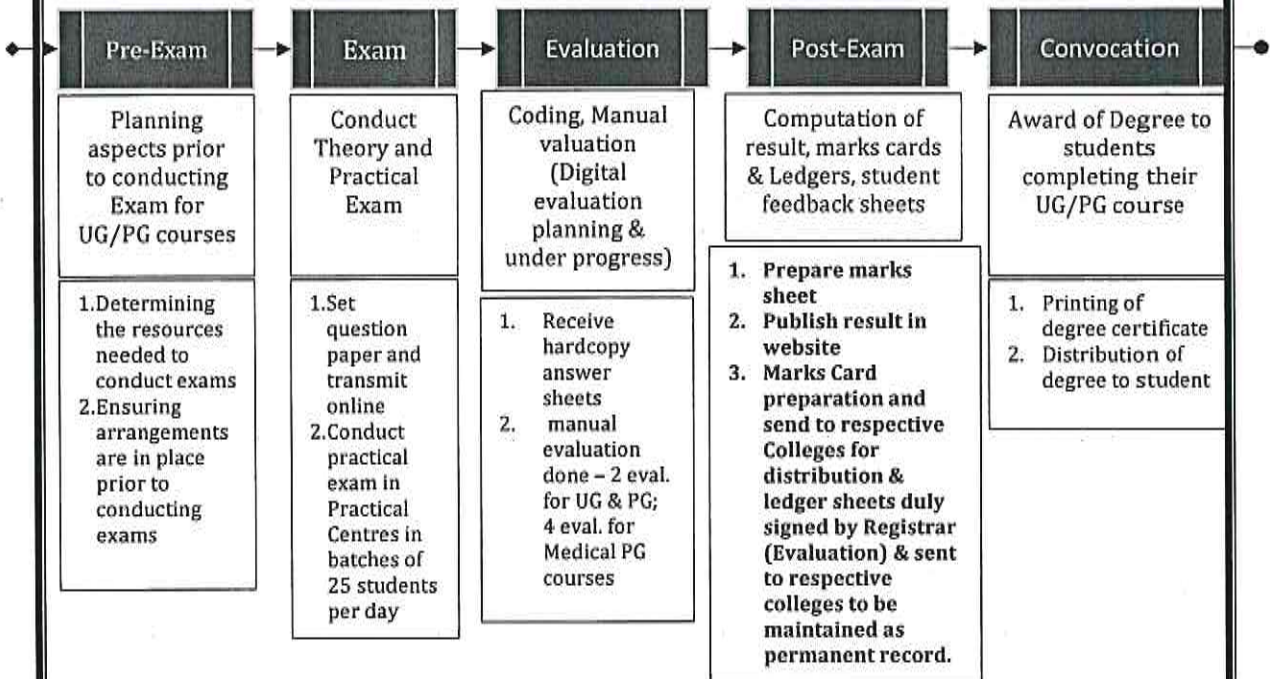
- (a) Pre-Exam – planning aspects prior to conducting Exam;
- (b) Exam – Conduct Theory and Practical exams;
- (c) Evaluation – Assessment of Theory answers and Practical tests;
- (d) Post-Exam – Computation of Result; and
- (e) Convocation – Award of Degree to students completing UG/PG course.

Convocation sub-process will be applicable for students passing-out after completing their UG / PG course.

FUNCTIONAL STRUCTURE: -



PROCESS FLOW DIAGRAM: -



PROCEDURE DETAILS:-

1. Concerned officer prepares draft of exam schedule.
 - a. Regular batches and odd batches/supplementary for UG and PG courses are considered during exam schedule preparation.
2. Assistant Registrar (Evaluation) finalize the schedule in consultation with Dean / Principal.
3. Approval of schedule by Vice Chancellor on the recommendation by Registrar (Evaluation).
4. Circulate to constituent college 45 days prior to exam date.
 - a. Copy circulated internally to concerned sections – Admission, Academic Computer (under IT Services) Agency managing EMS, Finance and O/o Registrar and VC.
5. Following tasks are meanwhile accomplished prior to exam date.
 - a. Creation of "Theory Exam Centre" and "Practical Exam Centre".
 - i. Identified by Registrar (Eval.) on basis of request received from colleges.
 - ii. Typically, 350 seats per session is the standard criteria for creating a center.
 - b. "Observer" selection for Theory exam.
 - i. **Observer:** from different constituent colleges.
 - ii. **Flying Squad** is created from University side comprising of VC / Registrars / Dy. Registrar / Asst. Registrar – can go to any centre without prior intimation during conduct of exam.
 - c. Selection of "Examiners" for Practical exams.
 - i. Create Teacher's panel for each subject -Professor /Associate Professor/ Asst. Professor / Lecturer eligible to be examiner.
 - ii. BOS-- Panel separately of internal & external examiners.
 - Teacher Panel for practical examiner is very important. Hence, yearly once the panel is updated.
 - Hardcopy of teacher's Bio-Data obtained from each college/University & list is updated.
 - Conduct BOS (Board of Study) meeting periodically to update the panel.
 - Next, BOAE (Board of Appointment of Examiners) meeting conducted. Practical Centres identified. Power vested to add / delete examiners

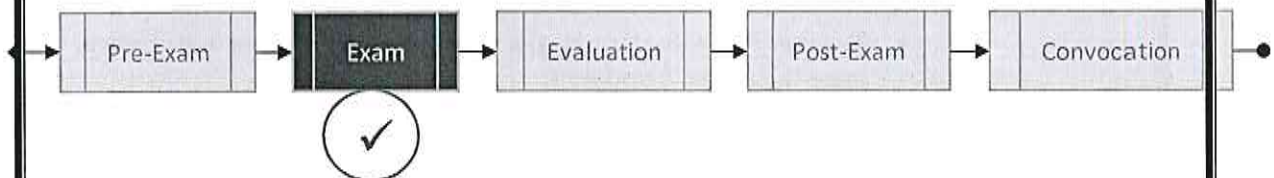
from Panel and also can recommend Registrar (Evaluation) to blacklist based on feedback of previous year(s).

Composition of BOAE:

- VC
- Dean
- Chairman BOS
- Registrar (Evaluation)
- Selection of Examiners by BOAE/Vice Chancellor

Roles and responsibilities: Scrutinizing examiners for practical examination.

- iii. Eligibility criteria based on Guidelines from Apex Board (viz., MCI, INC, PCI, AICTE etc).
 - iv. Internal examiner is selected from same college. External examiner is selected from outside the state or a different / Private /Deemed University.
 - In UG courses:
 - Medical course: 2 internal & 2 external (total 4 examiners)
 - For all other courses: 1 internal & 1 external (total 2 examiners)
 - Medical PG Course
 - 2 internal & 2 external (total 4 examiners)
- d. Creation of "Time-Table".
- i. Each subject Professor / Asst. Professor / Lecturer who is eligible as examiner.
 - ii. Eligibility criteria based on Guidelines from Apex Board viz., NMC, INC, PCI, UGC, AICTE etc...
- e. Scrutinize eligibility of students.
- i. Attendance check of students upon college entering details of students to appear in the exam.
 - ii. Guided by Statues, Ordinances, Acts, Apex body guidelines.



1. Question Paper (QP) bank is created having multiple versions.

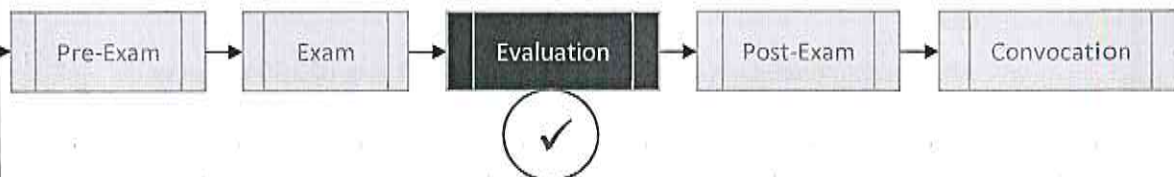
- a. The creation of QP bank is highly confidential and knowledge is limited to few people within the section.



2. Question papers are set by internal & external examiner drawn from panel of examiners subject wise. A minimum of 10 QP sets are maintained by Registrar (Evaluation). All these question papers shall be scrutinized by Senior faculty and kept ready for transmission online.
3. Vice Chancellor shall select 24-48 hrs before the time of examination and Registrar (Evaluation) shall arrange to transmit the same half an hour before the time of commencement of examination.
4. Online transmission of exam QP's.

Note: If 9.30 AM is exam start time, then at 8.45 AM the ZIP file of Theory Paper is made available for download by college exam centres. At 9.05 AM the system generated password is shared with each exam centre.

- a. 45 minutes before commencement of exam ZIP file link is uploaded to the designated email of Chief Superintendent.
 - i. Theory Exam Centre in college will download the file.
 - b. 15-30 minutes before commencement of exam, arrangements are made in such a manner that the system generates password and displays for sharing with college Exam Centres.
 - i. On getting password, the Chief Superintendent / Authorised person in the college Exam Centre opens the file and takes printout.
 - c. QP's distributed to students.
5. Conducting Practical exam.
 - a. Oral evaluation (Viva) and practical evaluation of student is done by examiner(s).
 - b. College Practical Centre makes batch of 25 students per day.



EVALUATION sub-process involves following broad steps: -

- (a) Receiving of Theory Papers in O/o Registrar Eval. from Theory Exam Centre.
 - (b) Upon decoding of answer sheets by Coding section, the same is bundled in cloth bags duly stitched and sent to Scanning section for scanning and uploading answer sheets for Digital evaluation.
 - (c) Receiving of Practical Marks in Online Portal of Examination Computer section from Practical Exam Centre.
1. **Receipt of Theory Paper** (in hardcopy format) from Theory Exam Centre received in Coding section.
 - a. Receive the Theory papers.



- i. Papers received on same day within half an hour of completion of examination.
- b. Make entry in the Inward Register.
 - i. No. of QP's
 - ii. Each QP, No. of Bundles
 - iii. Date and Time of receiving
- c. Acknowledgement given, stamped with date & time.
 - i. 1st copy: for department/ACU
 - ii. 0
 - iii. 2nd copy: for College Theory Centre
- d. Distinct number is provided for traceability.
- e. Grouped QP allocated to a person for verification.
 - i. Allocation detail is maintained in Verification Register.
 - ii. Verify receipt of:
 - CD
 - Observer report in sealed envelop
 - Acknowledgement
 - Bundle
- f. The QP No. is put in a separate bundle of scripts in each packet (bundle of 20 scripts for digital evaluation, in case of manual evaluation: UG = bundle of 15 scripts; PG = bundle of 10 scripts). Last packet to mention leftover Nos. (Less than 20 in such case).
- g. After making small packets these are put into 1 bag of 300 script each.
- h. After completion of verification, make sacks of Part I slips.
 - i. UG: Part I slips of 75 each, last packet with leftover slips are put.
 - ii. PG: Part I slips of 50 each, last packet with leftover slips are put.
- i. Make course-wise carton of cloth bags, if large then multiple bags QP-wise, stitch the cloth bag.
- j. Details are entered in software.
- k. Work Done Statement is printed in 3 copies and sent:
 - i. 1st copy: Office copy
 - ii. 2nd copy: To Finance for payment
 - iii. 3rd copy: To Registrar (Evaluation)
- l. Upon completion of decoding of answer script, the cloth bags containing the QP's are sent to Scanning section.



- i. A vendor is selected for scanning and uploading answer sheets on a separate server.
2. **Receipt of Practical Marks** from Practical Exam Centre (in Online Portal of Examination Computer section)
 - a. Examiner team at Practical Exam Centre feed the marks obtained by each student in the practical exam session (per batch per subject basis) as well as internal assessment marks obtained by students in their college.
 - b. Queries (if any) are resolved by Examination Computer section.
3. **Evaluation of answer sheets.**

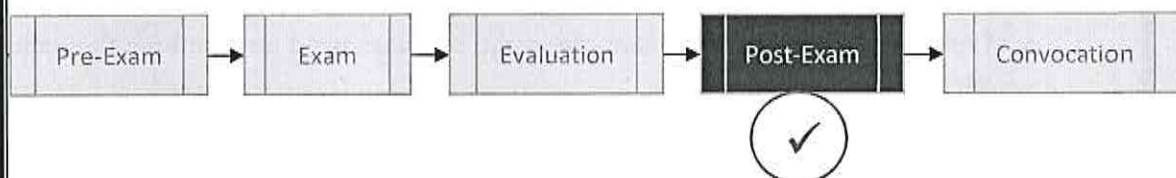
DIGITAL EVALUATION (Planning under process): It is planned to follow Digital Evaluation from July-August 2023 Examination onwards.

- a. Digital evaluation is done using the same software used for scanning the answer sheets.
 - i. For UG course, 2 evaluators used.
 - ii. For PG Medical course, 4 evaluators used - 2 from college 1 from other university (within State) and 1 from outside Karnataka state as per Apex Body norms.
- b. The software displays the answer sheet and evaluator needs to enter marks based on answer, one cannot see another evaluator's marking, nor is student details displayed.
 - i. In case of UG course evaluation:
 - If difference of marks between 2 evaluators is 15% or more, the software auto feature sends to a 3rd evaluator (without any court directions). Average of two marks close to each other among 3 valuations are picked by the software to generate average marks during result preparation.
 - In case one of the 2 evaluators gives 'N/A' (Not Answered) as a marking to a question which the student has answered, the evaluator is asked to come to the university for re-evaluating the particular question(s) where he has given remarks or 'N/A'. Once done, the software generates average marks during result preparation.
 - ii. In case of PG course evaluation:
 - Average of the 4 evaluator's marks is considered while preparing result (this is auto selected by the software). If the difference of marks between any two valuations exceeds 15%, such papers are subjected for 5th valuation. The average of four marks **close to each other** is considered for final computation of result.

MANUAL VALUATION

- a. Packet of 15 scripts for UG and 10 scripts for PG is made.
- b. Identify Theory valuation centre. Distribute packets to the centres.

- c. The scripts has provision for separately recording the marks to be given by evaluator 1 and evaluator 2. Both evaluation marks are available with the custodian.
- d. In case the difference of marks between evaluator 1 and evaluator 2 exceeds 15%, the custodian on the instruction by Registrar evaluation passes the answer scripts to evaluator 3.
- e. The marks given by evaluator 1 or evaluator 2 or evaluator 3 are kept confidential between the evaluators by custodian.
- f. Once manual evaluation is complete, an online screen is made available to the computer centre for question-wise marks entry of all the 3 evaluators.



POST-EXAM sub-process involves '**Routine**' exam evaluation tasks and few '**Non-Routine**' tasks.

(a) Routine exam evaluation tasks contain following broad steps:-

- 1) Computation of Results – including manual results in case of Manual valuation.
- 2) Preparation of Marks Card.
- 3) Take student feedback on satisfaction levels.

(b) Non-Routine tasks contain requests on matters pertaining to verification of marks / degree certificate, duplicate marks card / degree certificate, etc. The activities are further elaborated below.

1. Computation of Results.

a. Marks sheet is prepared by Results section (Now an agency).

- i. Examination Computer section does data management, take data from online server to computation server for Results section to further work on it.
- ii. Sources of data for computation are:
 - Internal Assessment marks (for courses where applicable) entry done in university portal through link given to each college with a user ID and password.
 - Practical / Clinical and viva marks entry through the college portal (i.e., university portal through link given to college with a user ID and password).
 - Theory marks USN-wise, QP Code-wise are sent by Agency to computer section.
 - Student data is provided by agency after scanning Part-I data.



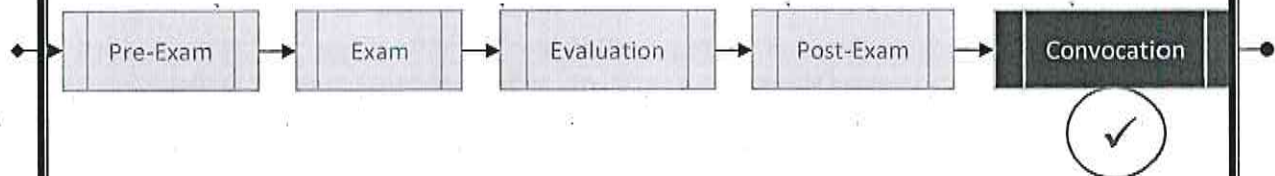
- iii. Amalgamate the above 4 data sources for computation of Results.
 - b. Result (Pass /Fail) is based on passing criteria specified in Ordinance Governing Rules of respective faculty / course / scheme in ACU. Each course can have multiple scheme of exams.
 - c. Publish result on net (website) under Results menu
 - i. However, student cannot opt for re-evaluation because
 - The paper has been evaluated by eligible teachers;
 - Sufficient time to evaluate the papers by the teachers has been given;
 - Minimum two (2) valuations by different faculties has been done.
 - d. Result will be stored in Result database.
- 2. Marks Card preparation.**
- a. Marks Card section to run the designated report to ascertain marks of passed candidates.
 - b. Print Marks Card.
 - i. Re-print issues take place due to Name correction, Duplicate marks card, or Subject incorporation issue in present software.
 - c. Enter manually serial no., registration number and college code against each marks sheet in an excel sheet. Enter serial no. and registration number in manual register. The entries are reviewed by Assistant Registrar and Dy. Registrar as part of verification to ensure correctness.
 - d. Update the server.
 - e. Generate Marks Card printed list immediately after cleaning all the results.
 - f. Handover to marks card dispatch section/constituent colleges.
 - g. Marks Card sent to respective colleges for distribution to students.
 - h. Ledger sheets shall be printed immediately after printing marks cards and sent to the colleges who have to maintain the same as permanent record.
- 3. Student Feedback.**
- a. In order to determine the learning effectiveness of Curriculum Delivery Design, it is important to collect feedback information from Students as it helps in assessing the strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities through an informed review process.
 - b. The feedback shall help validate the degree of intended outcome achieved from the Curriculum Delivery Design activity after the same was released for implementation in Colleges during or prior to the academic year. The results achieved can help in identification of internal areas in planning and resource allocation for taking improvement actions.
- Refer **Annexure-1: Student Feedback Form** in this document.
- c. Students who have not done well in the exam (typically failed in one or more subject) may need Academic Counselling or are having to confront challenges that

may be affecting their studies and need Professional Counselling shall be referred to Student Welfare section for Student Counselling / Mentoring.

4. Non-Routine Tasks:

a. Post-Exam section can receive various requests to be catered:

- Requests received by HRD Verification section
 - On receipt of request from external source (can be government, another university, or any organization) to validate the correctness / genuinity of the marks card / result.
 - Response is given within **15 working days** from date of receipt of request.
- Requests received by Marks Card section
 - Re-print marks card on account of Correction in Student Name, Fathers name, Mothers name & date of birth.
 - Duplicate marks card by Student / ex-Student – upon completion of relevant formalities, including submission of FIR copy as a proof of original marks card getting lost / tampered / mutilated.



1. Examination Computer section provides Eligible Candidate data (Dec-Mar every year).
 - a. Eligible Candidate for Convocation means the Student has passed in all subjects from all previous semesters and has therefore completed the course.
2. Obtain Rank List from Result section. Based on rank list, prepare the Gold Medal list.
3. Host on the website as provisional with a period of 15 days against any query / objection (marks withheld students will also be included).
 - a. If there is query, it will be rectified by Examination Computer section and Convocation section will get the corrected list.
 - b. If there is no objection, list will be finalized.
4. Students will be communicated to attend convocation.
5. Issue the certificates to those who are present during convocation (in person candidates). For absentia students, certificate will be sent by post.

POLICY ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY



B.G. Nagara – 571448

1. Preamble

“The methods that will most effectively minimize the ability of intruders to compromise information security is our comprehensive user training and education”

“University a need has also arisen for streamlining the process of procurement, maintenance and disposal of the computing resources in the university. A policy document in this regard has therefore become necessary in the university.

2. The IT Policy

The IT policy shall include the following inspects.

- Services to be provided by the Computer Section.
- Addressing to the problem of Accessibility of the Computing Resource.
- Departmental Computing Facilities.
- Maintenance of Computing Resources.
- Networking, Maintenance and Upgradation.
- Development, Maintenance and Upgradation of software used in the administration of the University.
- Printers and Printer Usage.
- Upgradation and disposal of obsolete or unusable IT Infrastructure.
- Risk management of IT Infrastructure
- Budgetary Provisions
- Amendments and Reforms

2.1.1 Services to be provided by the Computer Section.

The Computer Section shall provide the following services:

- Maintain the Computing facility for use by the students of the different Academic programs. Few of the lab computing facility will maintained available for 24x7 for the students if needed.
- Provide Computing resources to the Faculty Members, Departmental offices, Library and the Administration.
- Procure and maintain software required for administrative and other purpose of the ACU University.
- Set up and maintain the campus Computer Hardware's and networking.
- Provide Internet, E-mail IDs, Database Services etc. to the users.
- Assist the administration in the process of selection and procurement of computing resources.
- Organize training programmes for the faculty and staff from time to time, Computer Section help to students for their project work.

2.1.2 Addressing the Accessibility Problem.

To address the problem of accessibility of the Computer facility, Computer laboratories at different Academic buildings in the University has been set up, The objective of having these laboratories are as follows.

- Making Resources available nearest to the user Departments.
- Providing services like E-mail, Web services, File services, etc to the users.
- Conducting Computer lab sessions of the users Department.
- Conducting skill test for Recruitments.
- Providing resources for conducting online exams like GATE and recruitment tests.
- Organizing lab sessions for refresher courses and workshops for the user departments.

2.1.3 Departmental Computing Facilities.

The individual Departments shall be allowed to set up computing laboratories only where specialized computing resources are necessary. Permission for setting up of such a facility shall be given by the Vice Chancellor on recommendation by the concerned Director on receiving proper justification from a Department.

The Department shall consult the Computer Section regarding the requirements for maintenance of the computing resources. The Computer Section shall provide maintenance support for computing resources. For computing resources of substantial size and beyond the expertise of the section, the maintenance is to be made by a third party.

To maintain the security and integrity of examination related data, set of computers with separate LAN will be created for additional security.

Separate LAN is maintained at the Central Library to digitize content of various, Users can access this e-content either from the Intranet based network and outsiders can access this content using Internet.

2.1.4 Maintenance of Computing Resources.

The post-warranty maintenance of the servers and the UPSs shall be carried out through AMC. The PCs provided to the Departments/Sections by the computer section shall be maintained by the technical staff of the section. Appropriate stock of spares shall be maintained for the purpose of maintenance. A small buffer of PCs, UPSs and printers shall be maintained for the temporary replacement in critical uses cases.

2.1.5 Networking, Maintenance and Upgradation.

The campus LAN and Wi-Fi facility shall be maintained by the computer section. The LAN shall cover all the academic Departments, offices, hostels and the residential area. The Wi-Fi facility shall be provided in the entire campus in phase-by-phase manner. Appropriate technology shall be used for the networking while the procurement, installation, administration and maintenance of the networking equipment shall be the responsibility of the computer section. The Computer Section shall not be responsible for the computing resources in the hostels and the residential areas except in cases identified by the competent authority, Maintenance of the network will be done periodically by competent service engineers, so as to avoid any kind of connectivity or network issues, From time to time upgradation or replacement of the obsolete component of the network will also be done in order to improve the network performance for the users.

2.1.6 Development, Maintenance and Upgradation of software.

- The source code of software development in house both by the software professional or students must be available.
- Every upgradation of software package must be supported by proper documentation and justification. Licensed software procured must be upgraded to new versions.
- The software packages that have already been procured or developed in-house will be distributed to different user departments based on the user requirement assessment. Wherever possible these software packages shall be integrated under suitable framework to enhance sharing of resources and utilization taking into consideration the security concerns, While developing new software, its flexibility for integration must be studied.

2.1.7 Printers and Printer Usage.

Getting documents printed is an important part of computing activity However, it can be also quite costly as the printing stationaries are often expensive.

Therefore, it is necessary to be prudent in the supply and uses of printers. The policy on the supply of printers shall be as follows. One laser printer shall be provided to each of the following:

- Vice chancellor, Deans, Heads of the Departments, Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Librarian, Finance Officer, University Engineers, Department Officers, Professors, Associate Professors, Warden Officers, Administrative Sections.
- Depending upon the size of the faculty, each department shall be provided (One for each faculty cabin room) to be easily accessible to the faculty members.

- The Computer Section shall procure printer cartridges.
- Printers shall be made available in laboratory or in common places for taking printouts by the students and scholars. Research scholars shall be allowed laser prints free of cost.
- Private parties shall be allowed to set up print shops within the university campus to enable students to take additional printouts, however, they will be restricted to access to the network.

2.1.8 Upgradation and Disposal of Obsolete or Unusable IT Infrastructure and Associated Resources.

- The Committee shall assess the status of the resources periodically and shall be empowered to declare a computing resources as obsolete and to recommend its disposal. The resources tagged as obsolete will be replaced by staff-of-the-art resource and is subject to availability of funds without affecting the users.
- The obsolete resource is may be given to hardware labs, exchanged with state-of-the-art systems under buy back options. The University may also decide to donate such systems to organization, such as Schools, if the organization finds them usable, then the obsolete resources should be disposed by following the e-waste policy.

2.1.9 Risk Management of IT Infrastructure.

With growing dependency on IT infrastructure, the threats and vulnerabilities to IT infrastructure are of great concern today. IT infrastructure faces several risks and the risk exposure may vary from time to time. It is necessary to perform IT infrastructure risk assessment in regular basis and there shall be an Incident response and disaster recovery team for the university. The University shall follow the risk management policies are given below:

- Periodic and necessary backup of critical data should be taken in geographically separated location.
- Keeping IT infrastructure under surveillance.
- Use of fire alarm, smoke alarm and fire extinguisher.
- Earthquake resistance buildings.
- Physical security for theft control.
- Use of antivirus tool for protecting servers, desktops and network devices from malwares and regular updating of firewall.
- Regular updating of software with security patches.

2.1.10 Budgetary Provisions

The upgradation of network and its associated components and other computing and access resources need to be done on scheduled basis. To meet out the finance issues related to above mention upgradation, budgetary provisions are made for every academic session. The following are the areas which considered majorly for finalizing the budgetary provisions.

- Computing and access resource like Server, Computers etc.
- Hardware components related to Routers, switches. Wi-Fi etc.
- System and Application Software related to windows, server etc.
- Surveillance, printing and LCD related facility.
- Security related software's.
- AMC related for Server, Switches, Wi-Fi, Computers etc.
- Internet connectivity related expenses.

2.1.11 Amendments and Reforms

Amendments and reforms to the policy, may be incorporated as and when it is considered appropriate and new policies or the changes in policy will take effect immediately after a brief announcement by any means, e-mail and printed notices.

MARKET SURVEY AND ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS

Nagarur is a village located in North Bengaluru (having a population of 4510098 as per 2011 survey) and is 26 kms from Bengaluru Urban District. It belongs to Dasanapura Gram Panchayat and is surrounded by villages Hosahalli Palya, Govindapura, Honnasandra, Hunchanapalya, Pillahalli, Kodipalya, Seshagiri Rao Palya, Mariyana Palya, Narasipura and Torenagasandra.

There are no Government Medical Colleges in the whole North Bengaluru offering quality medical facilities and healthcare to the huge population of North Bengaluru which is home to nearly 85722 household (as per 2011 survey) which would have doubled in the last 12 years. Patients from all these villages must travel all the way to Bengaluru district for getting quality healthcare facility.


This area together with surrounding 30-40 villages with a population of nearly 40000 has no PHC. However as per **Rural Health Statistics 2020-2021** of Govt. of India, for every 30000 population one PHC is necessary, and this area is lacking in getting adequate healthcare facility and hence there is need for a medical college and hospital for providing basic healthcare facilities to the population.

Also, as per the same report, there is shortage of Manpower (Doctors/Specialities) in Karnataka rural sector which makes a strong case for having a medical college in this area to fulfil the shortfall.

As per the Annual Report 2018-19 of Govt. of India, the medical education policy highlighted the need for creating 58 medical colleges in the underserved area of the country with an intake of 100 seats in each medical college to create additional intake of under-graduate courses. However, no government college is established to serve the people of North Bengaluru and people of this area in Nagarur and surrounding villages are deprived of quality healthcare facilities. Hence, there is great demand for a medical college in this area.

Considering the above information, we strongly feel there is need for a medical college in the area proposed, Nagaruru, Dasanapura Hobli, North Bengaluru to serve the population of the catchment areas of Bengaluru urban, Bengaluru rural, Tumakuru and Ramanagara districts. More so, a medical college from the Adichunchanagiri University with its objective of serving the rural population would serve the needs of the people by providing quality healthcare facilities at very reasonable cost and even free to the needy.

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Rural Health Care System in India

1. Rural Health Care System – the structure and current scenario

The health care infrastructure in rural areas has been developed as a three tier system (see *Chart 1*) and is based on the following population norms:

1.1 As on 31st March, 2021, there are 156101 Sub Centres (SC), 25140 Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and 5481 Community Health Centres (CHCs) which are functioning in rural areas of the country. (Section IV, Table 6).

Sub Centres (SCs)

1.2. The Sub Centre is the most peripheral and first contact point between the primary health care system and the community. Sub Centres are assigned tasks relating to interpersonal communication in order to bring about behavioral change and provide services

As on 31st March, 2021, there are 156101 numbers of rural SCs functional in the country. The significant increase in SCs from year 2005 has been observed in the States of Rajasthan (3019), Gujarat (1888), Madhya Pradesh (1315) and Chhattisgarh (1297).

in different programmes like maternal and child health, family welfare, nutrition, immunization, diarrhoea control and communicable diseases as well as non-communicable diseases. Each Sub Centre is required to be manned by at least one

auxiliary nurse midwife (ANM) / female health worker and one male health worker for details of staffing pattern, (see *Box 1*) and for recommended staffing structure under Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) (see Annexure I). Under NHM, there is a provision for one additional second ANM on contract basis. One lady health visitor (LHV) is entrusted with the task of supervision of six Sub Centres. Under the Swap Scheme, the Government of India has taken over an additional 39554 Sub Centres from State governments / Union territories since April, 2002 in lieu of 5434 Rural Family Welfare Centres transferred to the State governments / Union territories. There are a total 156101 Sub Centres functioning in rural areas of the country as on 31st March, 2021 (Section IV, Table 6). At national level there is an increase of 10075 numbers of SCs from the year 2005. The significant increase in SCs has been observed in the States of Rajasthan (3019), Gujarat (1888), Madhya Pradesh (1315) and Chhattisgarh (1297). (Section I, Comparative Statement 1).


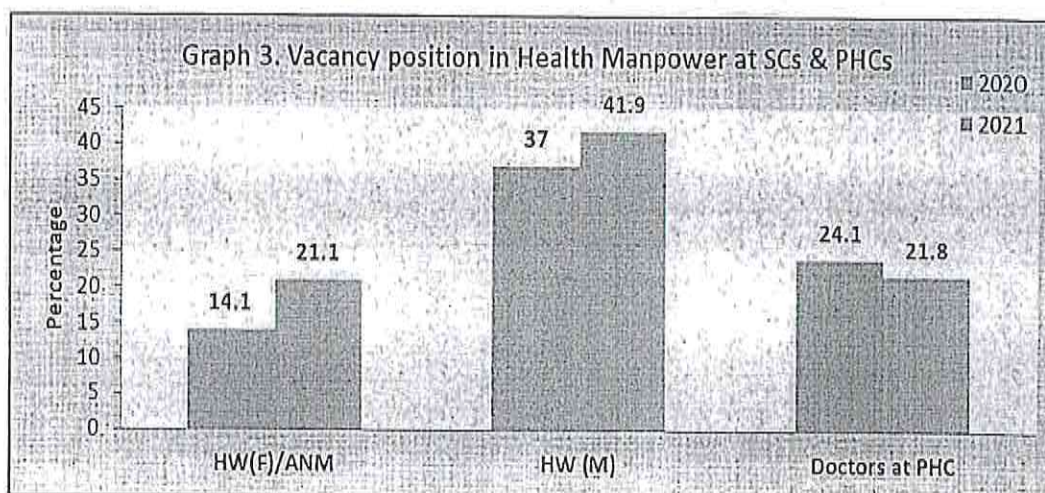
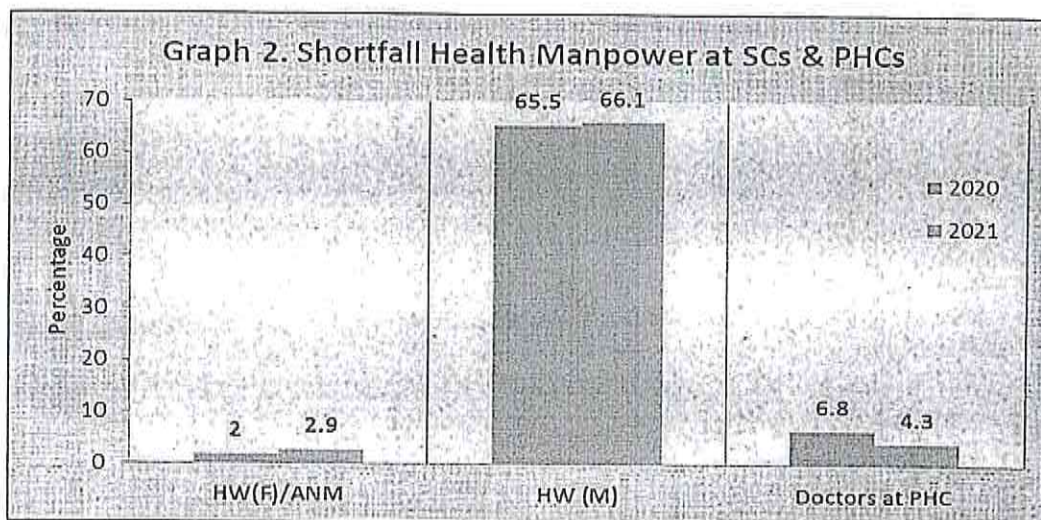



2.6. PHC is the first contact point between village community and the Medical Officer. Manpower in PHC includes a Medical Officer supported by paramedical and other staff. In case of PHC, for Health Assistant (male + female), the shortfall is 72.2%. For allopathic doctors at PHC, there is a shortfall of 4.3% of the total requirement at all India level. This is again mainly due to significant shortfall of doctors at PHCs in the States of Odisha (362), Karnataka (340) and Chhattisgarh (271). Apart from Allopathic doctors, there are 8709 AYUSH doctors available at PHCs. (Section V, Table 15, 16 and 17).

2.7. The Community Health Centres provide specialized medical care of surgeons, obstetricians & gynecologists, physicians and pediatricians. The current position of specialists manpower at CHCs reveal that as on 31st March, 2021, out of the sanctioned posts, 72.3% of Surgeons, 64.2% of Obstetricians & Gynecologists, 69.2% of physicians and 67.1% of pediatricians are vacant. The details of vacancy are represented in the graph 4. Overall 68% of the sanctioned posts of specialists at CHCs are vacant. Moreover, as compared to requirement for existing infrastructure, there is a shortfall of 83.2% of Surgeons, 74.2% of Obstetricians & Gynecologists, 82.2% of Physicians and 80.6% of Pediatricians. Overall,
